INCLUSIVENESS

Govt. Maharaja PG College was founded in the year 1865 with a sole vision to impart education and excellence to rural students to strive and redefine success, recognize responsibilities and shatter inhibitory glass ceilings. For more than a century, the institute has stood true to its founding principle of inclusiveness by transforming the lives of rural and marginalized young students through its quality education and practices at minimum cost. Chhatarpur is a pre-dominantly backward area with 20% ST, 02% SC, Child Sex Ratio: 883 and 59% population living in the rural area. Majority of the students come from rural areas are marginalized, socioeconomically disadvantaged, with low self-esteem and perception. Therefore, the college aims to develop a holistic and inclusive learning ecosystem that caters for these young minds. Inclusive education entails ease of access to the teaching-learning ecosystem, regardless of cognitive or disability challenges, and equal opportunities for holistic development among students of diverse capacities and different backgrounds.

PRACTICES

➤ **Educational Paradigm**

1. Special remedial & tutorial classes are arranged for the disadvantaged students.
2. The college runs some courses keeping assessment of the local requirements in the mind. Such courses are Bundeli Literature at the post graduate level, Industrial Microbiology, Electronics, Computer science, Computer Application at the under graduate level.
3. The college has introduced '**Tutor-Guardian Scheme**' which aims at solving the problems of the students and guiding them at every step in their day-to-day lives.

4. Teaching-learning excellence is promoted through blended education techniques/ practices, ICT, smart classes, audio and visual support system etc.
5. **'Cambridge Assessment English'** was introduced for students to improve communication skills in English.
6. **'Shabd Samarthya Sampreshan'** was organized by the Department of Hindi for students to improve communication skills in Hindi.

2. The college also provides free books and stationery to marginalized students. In 2019-2020, free books and stationery have been distributed among SC and ST students for worth Rs. 30,17,552 and Rs. 3,73,516 respectively.

➤ **Gender Sensitization**

The total strength of female students (3518) is less than male students (4423) in this college. To fill this gap, measures taken are as follows:

1. We prioritize creating a safe space for our students to gain a gender sensitive and empowering education.
2. Workshop on '**Self defence training**' for girls was organized on 28th- 30th Nov 2019. 251 girls participated in the workshop.
3. Special lectures are organized to motivate the girls to enter into higher education.
4. Financial support like '**Gaon ki Beti**' and '**Pratibha Kiran**' are provided to female students coming from rural and urban areas respectively.
5. A common room at the college provides space to hold some discussion and interactive session.
6. The college has constituted a '**Committee Against Sexual Harassment**' in accordance with the guidelines delineated by the UGC pertaining to the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressed) Act, 2013.

➤ **Capacity Enhancement and Community Reach Program**

1. Vivekananda Career Counseling Cell conducts various programs to develop essential soft skills of students required in their career thrice in a week.
2. The NSS unit of college has adopted '**Dhadari**' village; students extend their voluntary service for socio welfare of the village including plantation, cleanliness, blood donation and awareness on school enrolment.
3. Every year '**Sadbhavna Diwas**' is celebrated on 20 August by the students to promote national integration and communal harmony. They also take oath for the emotional oneness and harmony of all the people regardless of caste, religion, region and language.
4. The NCC unit of the college actively participates in various camps and drill exercises. This unit consists of a company of 160 cadets, a platoon of 54 cadets and an open platoon of 54 female cadets. 5 camps were organized in

Jabalpur, Katni, Chhatarpur and Dhana, Sagar. 50 cadets attended the Pre-RDC and 1 cadet (Sanjay Ahirwar) attended TSC in 2019.

5. **EBSB (Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat)** committee has signed MoU with Mizoram college for students exchange. This solely works for the aim of national integration.

➤ **Sports Culture**

1. The college has a vast stadium for sports activities. It contains a swimming pool, a gym hall, table tennis hall, badminton hall and open field for outdoor sports activities. The college holds national level sports event known as S.N. Banerjee Memorial Football Tournament in the honour of the first principal of the college. This sports event ranks at the sixth place among the football tournaments held at the national level. The renowned football teams from the prestigious football clubs are invited to participate.
2. Students are also motivated to participate in other sports like Wrestling, Badminton, Basketball, Kabadi and Cricket. Both boys and girls teams have participated in inter-college, state level and national level.
